Subject of Review: The longest-standing and largest (in terms of participating acres) federal risk management program is the Federal Crop Insurance Program (FCIP). Since its inception in the 1930s, the FCIP has grown to insure approximately 494 million acres of crops and rangeland representing insured liabilities of \$173 billion as of the 2022 crop year. The purpose of this report is to provide a comprehensive overview of the insurance portfolio that is made up of the individual policies relevant to crop production (including hay, pasture, range, forage) that is currently in effect within the FCIP. Focus is given to analyzing the trends in the book of business as well as rates of market penetration over the period 2007 to 2022. This is achieved by combining data from multiple sources to produce measures of FCIP participation that are decomposed by commodity, location, characteristics of the insurance plans, and producer demographics.
